At St Margaret's CE VA Primary School, we have children who are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM). We have used the Pupil Premium funding to continue running programmes that target all pupils who are disadvantaged or underachieving not just those eligible for FSM.

The money is used to support a variety of activities which both support and enhance learning.

This approach supports the academic achievement of our disadvantaged children, especially for those who lack help at home. It also allows the children to experience a host of different activities, which in turn lead to raising self-esteem and developing the whole child which has a positive impact on attainment and attitudes to learning.

2014 – 2015

The pupil premium grant ensured all our disadvantaged pupils made at least the expected progress or more for each individual.

93% made expected or above expected progress.

7% made less than expected progress.

Of our Pupil Premium children

47% exceeded age related targets

35% met age related targets

18% were below age related targets

The impact on attainment is monitored by teachers / SENCO / Headteacher and reports made to the Governing Body. Alongside this the School Finance Officer completes an audit of accounts to show how the money has been spent.
